

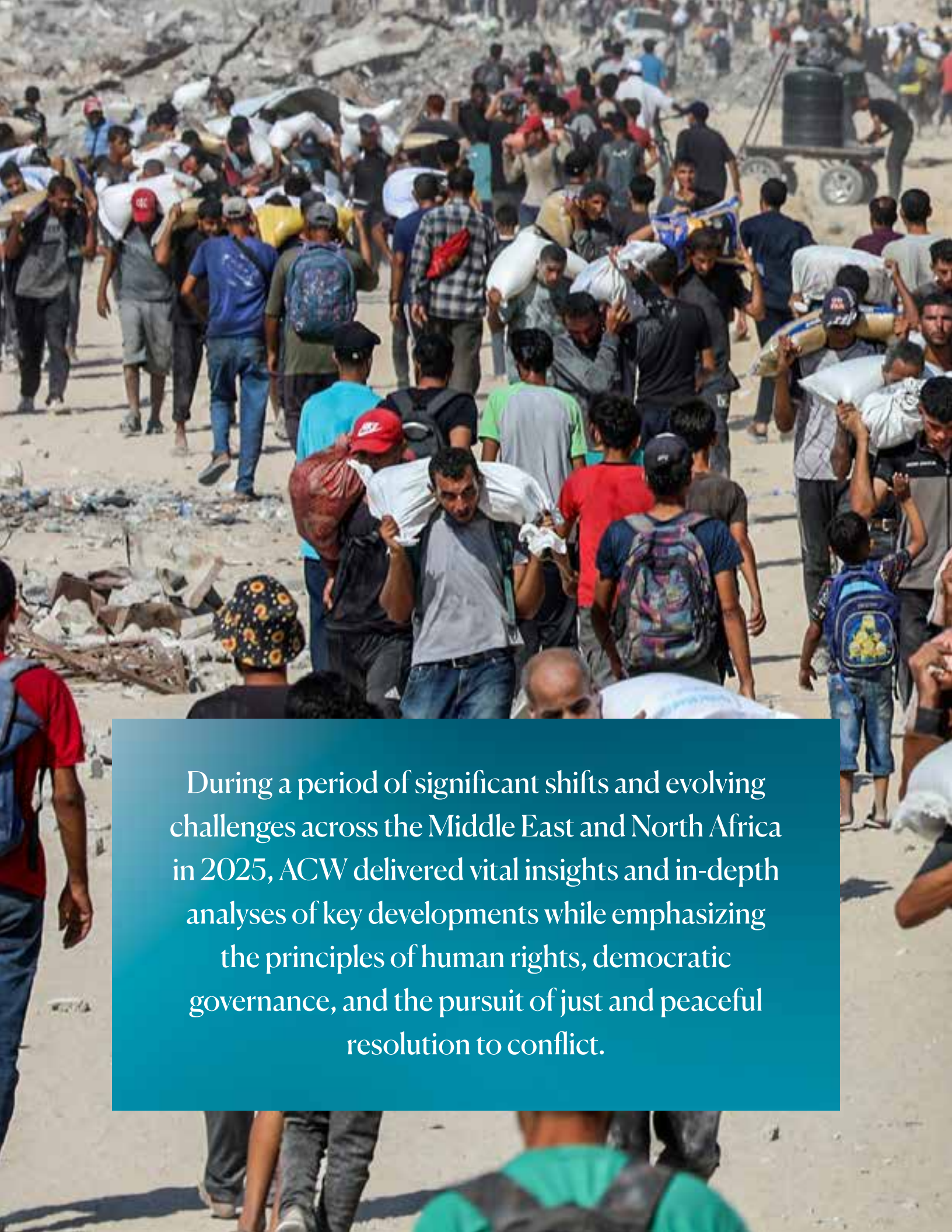

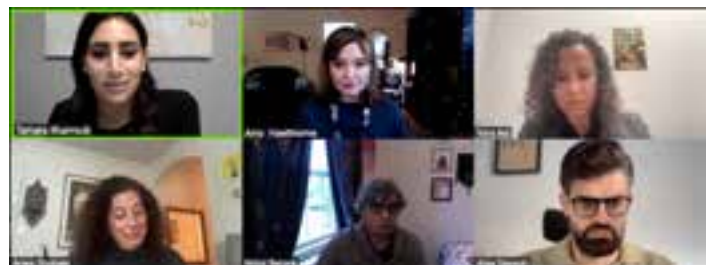

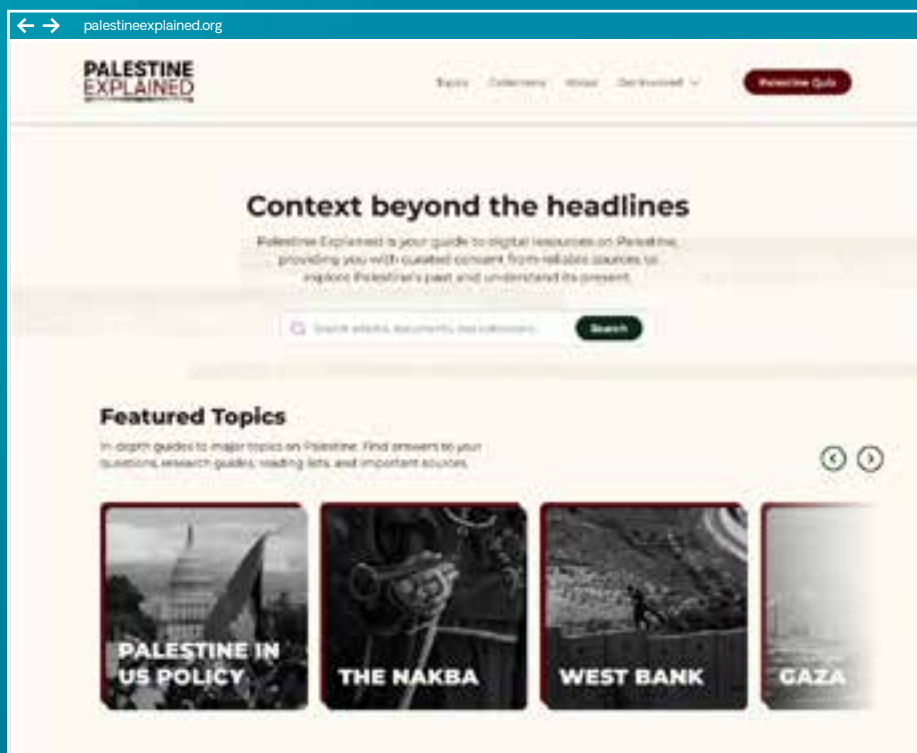


# PALESTINE EXPLAINED

## Filling a Gap in the Palestine Information Space

The last two years have seen a significant increase in demand for information about Palestine. ACW identified the need for a reliable platform to counter disinformation and censorship efforts and act as a one-stop shop for research on Palestine. While curating and aggregating information from various knowledge producers on Palestine into one centralized space, the platform offers information to users from introductory level to subject matter specialists, provides a user-friendly window into the vast world of digital resources on Palestine, offers context on these materials, and generates original resources to fill in informational gaps where necessary.

## Maintaining Impact and Visibility

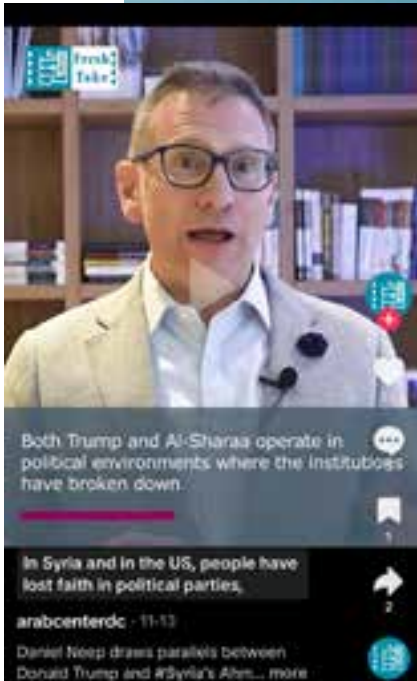

ACW experts contributed innovative insights in top media outlets and to shaping public and policy conversations.

ACW research fellows and analysts are regularly consulted and featured as expert contributors to the US and international media, at academic institutions and high-level conferences, with prominent US and global leaders, and in US government briefings, directly reaching hundreds of thousands of people world-wide.



## Delivering Critical Insights for Washington Policymakers

Over the past 10 years, ACW has built a strong reputation in the Washington policy community, establishing ourselves as a go-to research center for timely, accurate, and insightful analysis and information on the MENA region. In 2025, our government outreach program provided educational materials and policy analyses to congressional and executive branch staff and hosted several informational briefings for US legislators, ensuring our analyses and policy recommendations reached decisionmakers and played a key role in shaping foreign policy conversations in Washington DC. Among the many topics covered was Israel's war on Gaza, US relations in the Gulf, the transitional government in Syria, and social and political developments in North Africa.

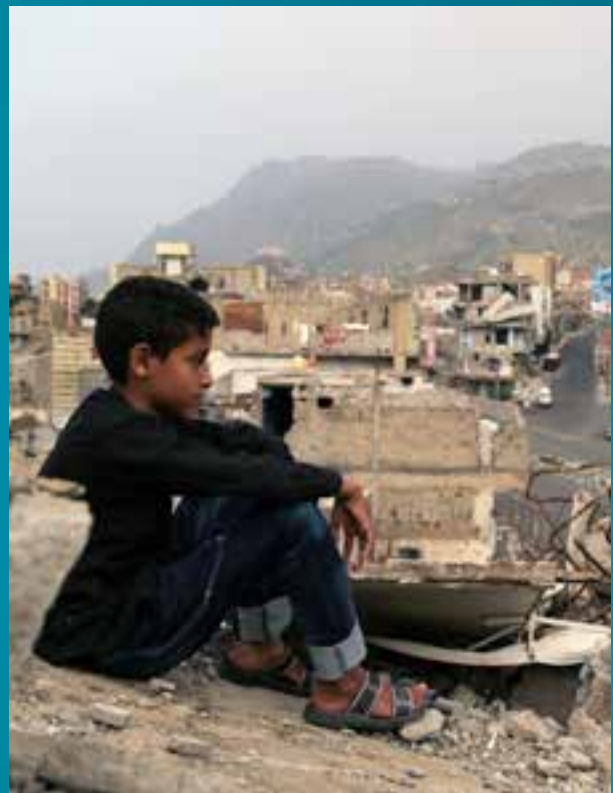

## Centering Human Rights and Democratic Transitions

ACW's dedication to justice-centered and evidence-based analysis, combined with our commitment to diversity and the inclusion of indigenous voices, helped set ACW apart from other think tanks. In 2025, ACW convened authoritative international experts and engaged with senior officials and civil society alike to aid decision making in the United States and around the world that prioritizes justice and human rights, advances democratic governance, and fosters long-term sustainable development and peace. Our work has been sought after by millions of people looking for objective, in-depth, justice-based analysis of developments in the MENA region.



# OUR Highlights

## A Record of Navigating Global Shifts with Expertise and Vision

The events that started on October 7, 2023 and the new developments across the region and in the United States over the two years since, have prompted Arab Center Washington DC to quickly adapt and adjust our programming to respond to the fast-changing and important developments across the region, while pursuing our mission of highlighting human rights concerns.

In 2025, ACW responded effectively to several major critical events and rapid developments both in the United States and in MENA, while maintaining our hard-earned reputation as an authoritative research center on Middle East politics and US policies and interests in the region.

### Examining the Political, Economic, Legal, and Humanitarian Dimensions of the Gaza Genocide

In 2025, ACW continued to provide in-depth analysis of Israel's war on Gaza, as well as of its various dimensions and broader impacts on the future of Palestine and Israel, regional dynamics, US policy, and the international order. Our work addressed a critical gap in research by prioritizing human rights and international law, while outlining policy approaches aimed at achieving a just and lasting peace.



## Charting Pathways to Democratic Transitions and Inclusive Governance in Syria, Lebanon, and Iraq

As major shifts swept the MENA region in 2025, governments grappled with new realities, political transitions, and economic challenges. Throughout 2025, ACW explored the evolving landscape of governance in the region and examined the challenges and prospects of inclusive and democratic transitions in Syria, Lebanon, and Iraq.



## Exploring Political Processes to End the Neglected Conflicts in Libya, Sudan, and Yemen

The crises in Libya, Sudan, and Yemen fell under the radar in 2025 and seem to have been forgotten and the suffering of civilians neglected. ACW examined the key drivers of these conflicts, regional and foreign intervening factors, the devastating humanitarian and destabilizing impacts, the challenges to pursuing political processes, and pathways toward reaching viable resolutions.



## Investigating Resurgent and Entrenched Authoritarianism in Egypt and North Africa

The year 2025 saw popular protests and tensions across North Africa over rising unemployment, inequality, declining public services, food insecurity, and further stifling free speech and dissent. ACW examined these trends of entrenched authoritarianism and their impacts, as well as prospects for democratic governance, socio-economic equality and development, and political reform.







## Assessing Israel's Regional Military Overreach and Threats to the Regional and Global Order

In 2025, ACW experts produced high-impact research and analysis of major events and regional developments especially Israel's expansionist agenda and its military attacks across the region, from Palestine to Lebanon, Syria, Iraq, Yemen, Iran, Qatar, and the flotillas in international waters, examining the impacts and broader implications for security, international law, and the global order.



## Responding to Emerging Threats of Climate Change, Social Media Influence, and AI-Assisted Warfare

Amid growing global concerns over the risks of climate change and the use of technology by authoritarian and oppressive regimes, ACW focused in 2025 on assessing the threats as well as the opportunities presented by these developments, examining the impacts of climate change in MENA and potentials for energy transitions and the effects of social media and AI technologies on human rights and freedoms.



## Navigating the Trump Administration's Policies toward MENA and their Domestic Implications

The first year of the second Trump administration has seen a fast pace of developments and mounting challenges to the work of human rights and democracy. In 2025, ACW excelled in providing timely and in-depth analysis of the impacts of policies like striking Iranian nuclear facilities, the Gaza ethnic cleansing and 20-point plans, development funding cuts and tariffs, sanctioning multilateral and international legal entities, transactional relations and strategic weapons agreements with the Gulf, as well as domestic repression and shifts in US public opinion, and their implications for US interests and politics and the broader global order.

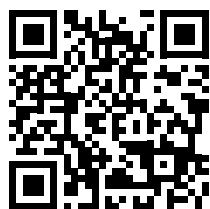
